The United East India Company (Dutch: Vereenigde Oostindische Compagnie [vər'e:niɣdə o:st'ɪndisə kɔmpə'ɲi]; abbr. VOC [ve: (j)o:'se:]), commonly known as the Dutch East. The Dutch East India Company (VOC) was formed in 1602 by the Staten-Generaal (States General) of the then Republic of the Seven United Netherlands. The company was granted a 21-year charter with rights to trade exclusively in Asia and to buy valuable spices, such as nutmeg, mace, and cloves. It shaped global commerce, financial innovation and political developments across Asia, Africa and Europe. About twenty-five million pages of VOC records have survived in repositories in. The Dutch East India Company, known as the VOC (Vereenigde Oost-Indische Compagnie), emerged in the early 17th century as a pioneering multinational corporation that reshaped global trade and marked the dawn of European colonialism in Asia. It combined private capital with state authority, creating a corporate entity that could trade, wage wars, govern territories, mint coins and.
