

How to run cable trays through explosion-proof walls



Overview

When cable trays pass through walls or floors, seal openings using fire-rated penetration sealing materials. Do not modify or damage the tray coating or structure during use. Where cables pass through shafts, walls, slabs, or enter electrical panels or cabinets, openings shall be tightly sealed with firestopping materials in accordance with. Cable Trays have been permitted in the hazardous (classified) locations in the National Electrical Code for Class I (flammable vapor and gases) since the 1978 NEC and have been used extensively in chemical plants, refineries, and other types of facilities. Cable Tray Penetrations: Problem Solved!

A simple and effective solution would be "Sleeve Systems." where cable trays are stopped a few feet short of the fire barrier, a sleeve installed and the tray picked up again on the other side of the barrier.
